Make-Your-Own Dryer Balls

Learn to make dryer balls from core wool and alpaca fiber. Participants will make 1-3 dryer balls and have the opportunity to purchase materials for additional balls to make at home if they wish. Placing 3 of the balls in the dryer with a load of clothes speeds up drying, eliminates static electricity and saves money. Class fee is \$30 (all materials provided). Rose-Petal Bead Making
