


Growing Healthy



The Growing Healthy program is a nutrition education program, serving all of the Racine Unified School District's first-graders. Children come to Eco-J for a field trip to experience a healthy food taste test in the garden and get up close to an alpaca while learning about digestion.

Farm Corps

Updates from Aubrey Gordon, Farm Corps and Property Manager:

• So far we have grown almost 3,000 pounds of produce and are expecting to donate over a third of that to the Northside Food Pantry in Racine! Our new volunteer intern, Ariana, goes to the pantry once a week to help distribute food. She also creates and distributes recipe cards with nutrition information specific to the harvested produce.

• We love the freedom to explore different things in the garden. This season we tried a version of the "three sisters" in the back garden with popcorn, Hidatsa shield beans, and pumpkins. We've also started using a cover crop called buckwheat to suppress weeds and revitalize our older beds.

 Despite some challenges this season, we were able to grow large amounts of food. In spring it was difficult to get the plants into the ground because it was always too cold or too wet. In summer, a large rainstorm caused the loss of a lot of crops, including almost all of our sunflowers, a large number of corn stalks, and a whole bed of carrots. Additionally, a lot of our squash, melons, and other crops with large leaves got powdery mildew, a fungus that can form when the leaves get

• To optimize our growing space, we tried out straw bale gardening, which allowed us to grow produce in an unprepped area. The outcome wasn't that great this year, but we're going to try again next year with some differing methods to try and make it work!



too wet and don't dry out.
